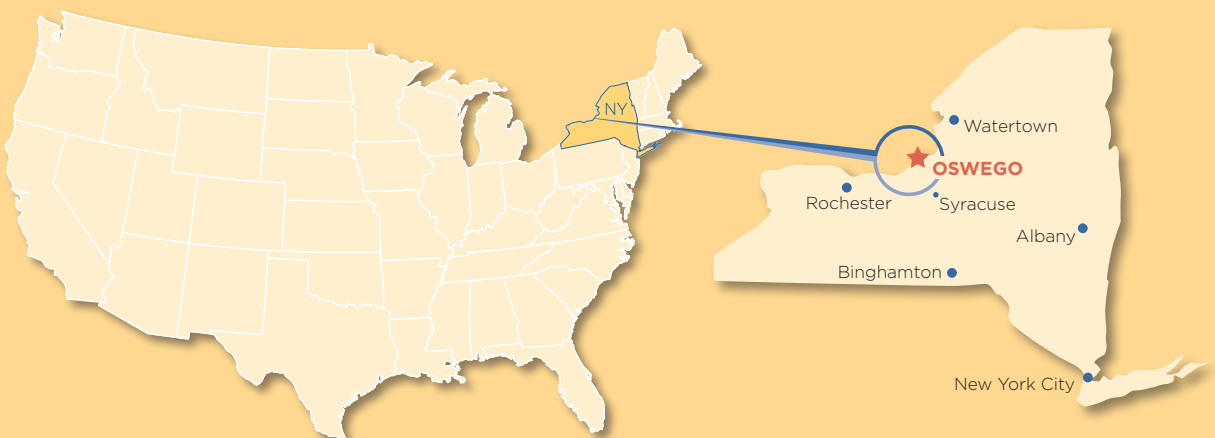

SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS

SUNY Oswego offers an automatic **\$6,000** or **\$9,000** Destination Oswego scholarship to all accepted undergraduate international students. This award is renewable for four years.

Students who score at least 1100 on the SAT and have at least a B+ high school average will also be considered for **additional Merit Scholarships**.

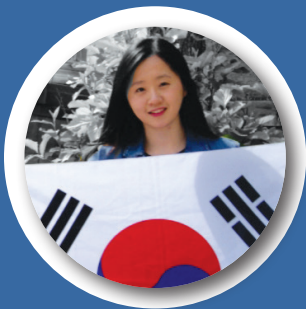

FOR UNDERGRADUATE (BACHELOR'S) STUDENTS

Step 1Apply online: oswego.edu/international/undergraduate-applications

Step 2Pay \$50 application fee

Step 3Submit required documents, including:

3A. Your official high school transcript (Minimum 2.5 GPA out of 4.0)

3B. Your English proficiency score:

GRADUATE HOW TO APPLY

FOR GRADUATE (MASTER'S) STUDENTS

Step 1Apply online: oswego.edu/graduate/graduate-admissions

Step 2Pay \$65 application fee

Step 3Submit required documents, including:

3A. Sealed official college transcripts

3B. Your English proficiency score: Either a 79 in TOEFL (83 for MBA students) or 6.5 in IELTS

Step 4Accepted students must also provide proof of financial support and a scanned copy biographic page of your passport.
